Kathleen brings a wealth of knowledge and host of skills that will allow her to build upon Sandra's past successes and take the organization to new heights," said Hood. Regarding being selected to join the organization, Spears said, "It is such an exciting time to lead *Waste Not* as we celebrate our 35th year of rescuing food that would otherwise go to waste and getting it onto plates in our community."

The Waste Not board of directors of will host a celebration in December welcoming Spears and acknowledging Staudt-Killea's 21-year commitment to the organization. "We owe a debt of gratitude to Sandra for her passion for the mission and commitment to excellence over the years. We are excited about Kathleen taking the lead at Waste Not and the innovations she will bring," said Hood.
